## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

This course offers an introduction to the history of western art from the ancient time to the Medieval Age. Topics of the course include a variety of art forms and their visual characteristics in different historical periods. Students will learn to appreciate the art works in journals, museums and galleries and understand their significance, and build up connections among art works, visual cultures, the western civilizations of different historical eras, and the social, geographical, political and cultural existence during the course.

Upon Completion of this Course, students will be able to:

1. Explain why it is necessary to study the history of art;

2. Describe the main visual characteristics of different western civilizations, periods and styles;

3. Analyze the social, cultural and economic realities of a variety of historical eras;

4. Appreciate various art works and artistic expressions;

5. Explain the characteristics of the western civilizations and their associations with the art works.
