COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the principles, concepts, and practices related to organizational design, and explores how the changing environment affects the way managers design and change organizational structure to increase organizational effectiveness. Topics covered include organizations and organizational effectiveness; organizational design; organizational structure; organizational culture; innovation and change; decision making; and managing conflict, power and politics. Through real-world examples, students will develop critical thinking skills and apply appropriate tools and techniques to analyze, evaluate, and design organizational structures that align with strategic goals and optimize organizational performance.

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand the principles and concepts related to organizational theory and design;
2. Identify and evaluate the internal and external factors influencing organizational structure and design;
3. compares and evaluates the strengths and weaknesses of various organizational structural forms;
4. Choose appropriate tools and techniques to design effective organizational structures;
5. Evaluate the impact of organizational design on individual and group behavior within organizations;
6. Recognize the challenges and opportunities associated with organizational



change and innovation.
