#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

This is an introductory course in the French language focus on real-life language use. Students are able to develop a basic proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Moreover, this course will develop students' knowledge and understanding of French cultures and societies. Note that Some English may be used at the beginning of the course, but by the end of the term, instruction will be conducted entirely in French.

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Build a foundational vocabulary and grasp essential grammar concepts to construct meaningful sentences and express ideas effectively;
- 2. Develop a basic proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing of French language;
- 3. Communicate effectively and interact confidently with other speakers of French in various contexts;
- 4. Employ effective language learning strategies to continue improving their French proficiency beyond the course;
- 5. Develop an appreciation of cultural practices, customs, and traditions in French-speaking regions;
